Case Types from American Academy of Periodontology

CASE TYPE I — Gingival Disease

- Inflammation of the gingiva (bleeding or exudate may be present)

CASE TYPE II — Early Periodontitis

- Progression of gingival inflammation into deeper periodontal structures and bone. Slight bone loss and slight connective tissue attachment (ligaments)

CASE TYPE III - Moderate Periodontitis

- More advanced stage of periodontal disease, increased distraction and noticeable bone loss. Possible tooth mobility and possible furcation involvement.

CASE TYPE IV - Advanced Periodontitis

- Further progression of periodontal disease, major loss of bone and increased tooth mobility
- Furcation involvement is very likely

CASE TYPE V - Refractory Periodontitis

- Patients with multiple disease sites that continue to show attachment loss even after therapy. Single or multiple sites of continued attachment loss.
